NOTIFICATION

Sub: Anti-dumping investigations concerning imports of Cathode Ray Colour Picture Tubes of 14” and 21” (flat) sizes originating in or exported from Malaysia, Thailand, China and Korea RP.

No. 14/8/2006-DGAD – Having regard to the Customs Tariff Act 1975 as amended in 1995 and the Customs Tariff (Identification, Assessment and Collection of Anti-Dumping Duty on Dumped Articles and for Determination of injury) Rules 1995, thereof, the Designated Authority (hereinafter also referred to as Authority), under the above Rules, initiated an investigation vide notification dated 25th September 2007 into the alleged dumped imports of Cathode Ray Colour Picture Tubes of 14” and 21” (flat) sizes originating in or exported from Malaysia, Thailand, China and Korea RP. The investigation was initiated on the basis of a written application received from M/s. Samtel Color Limited, (hereinafter referred to as petitioner) on behalf of domestic industry, alleging dumping of Cathode Ray Colour Picture Tubes of 14” and 21” (flat) sizes originating in or exported from Malaysia, Thailand, China and Korea RP.

2. The Authority issued a public notice dated 25th September 2007 initiating Anti-Dumping investigations concerning imports of Cathode Ray Colour Picture Tubes of 14” and 21” (flat) sizes. The subject goods falls under Chapter 85 of the Customs Tariff Act, 1975 under subheading no. 8540.11 of and under ITC HS Classification Rule, originating in or exported from Malaysia, Thailand, China and Korea RP (hereinafter referred to as subject countries). The product under consideration in the present case was Cathode Ray Colour Picture Tubes of 14” and 21” (flat) sizes [i.e., 21 flat type and 14” conventional]. (also referred to as subject goods hereinafter). The petition had been filed by M/s. Samtel Color Limited.

3. The petitioner vide their letter dated 3rd October 2007 has made a written submission before the Authority requesting termination of these anti-dumping investigations concerning imports of the subject goods from Malaysia, Thailand, China and Korea RP.

4. Rule 14 (a) of the Anti-dumping Rules provides that the Authority shall, by issue of a public notice, terminate an investigation immediately, if it receives a request in writing for doing so, from or on behalf of the domestic industry affected, at whose instance the investigation was initiated.

5. The Authority notes that the investigation into alleged dumping and injury was initiated on the basis of fully documented written request filed on behalf of M/s. Samtel Color Limited representing the Domestic Industry. The same applicant has now made a written submission requesting termination of present investigations.

6. Therefore, in terms of Rule 14 (a) of the Anti-dumping Rules above, the Authority hereby terminates the investigation initiated vide notification No. 14/8/2006-DGAD dated 25th September 2007 and all proceedings connected with this case.
